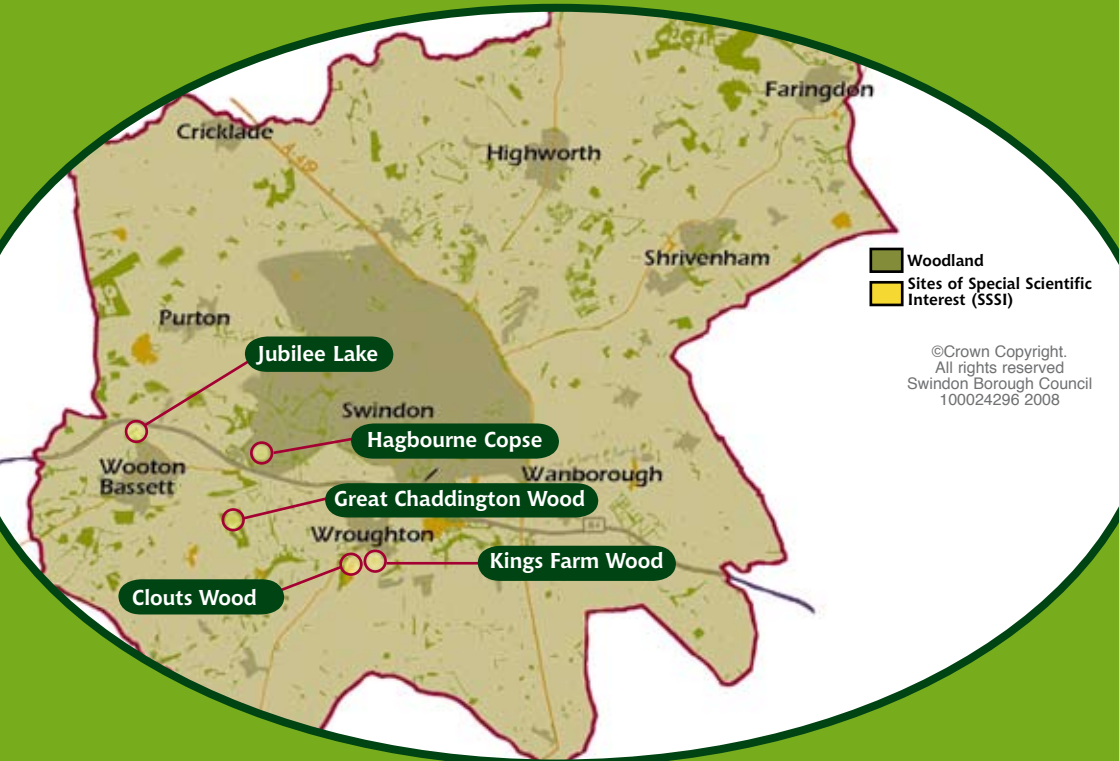




# Forests on your Doorstep

## Great Chaddington Wood

- Privately owned.

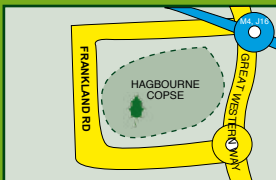
Planted in 1999 with poplar trees on Great Chaddington Farm near Wootton Bassett. Follow Great Chaddington Lane opposite Sally Pusey's Pub on the A3102 Swindon to Wootton Bassett Road. Go through the gate opposite Vowley Farm. Parking is available approx. 1.25 miles from the A3102 turning. Level site, grass paths, unsuitable for wheelchairs, no benches, can be wet underfoot. Circuit 1.5 miles.



## Hagbourne Copse

- Owned by Wiltshire Wildlife Trust

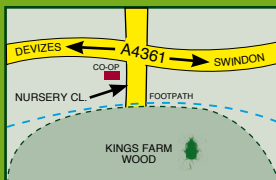
Ancient Semi-Natural 'bluebell' oak woodland on the edge of Swindon near Jct.16 of the M4. Level site with marked unsurfaced paths, unsuitable for wheelchairs, no benches. The entrance to the wood is opposite Express Holiday Inn on Frankland Road on the Blagrove Industrial Estate off the Great Western Way (A3102). Roadside parking. Circular about 0.25mile.



## Kings Farm Wood

- Privately owned. On the edge of Wroughton

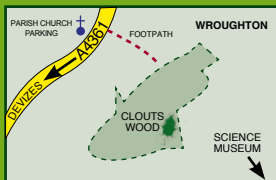
where the village meets the Downs. 24,000 trees were planted in 2001. Steeply sloping, no surfaced paths, unsuitable for wheelchairs and for anyone who finds steep slopes difficult; one bench at the top of the hill. Entrance to the wood is 250 yards from the Co-op car park via a footpath off Nursery Close. Circuit about 1.5 miles.



## Clouts Wood Nature Reserve

- managed by Wiltshire Wildlife

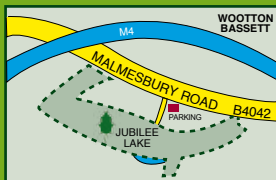
Trust. Ancient Semi-Natural Woodland and SSSI. Steeply sloping and some steps make it unsuitable for wheelchairs. No benches. Park in one of two lay-bys on the A4361 just outside Wroughton, or use car park at the Parish Church and walk up the hill to the gate on the left of the road going uphill. Follow the footpath across the fields to Clouts Wood. Circuit about 1.5 miles.



## Jubilee Lake Nature Reserve

- Owned by Wootton Bassett

Town Council. The Lake at the foot of a small valley was created in the 1930s. Paths have a sealed surface and are suitable for all users though slopes to and from the lake may present an obstacle for manual wheelchair use. Benches beside paths. No gates or stiles. Small car park at entrance; children's play area. Follow the 'brown signs' on the Wootton Bassett to Malmesbury Road (B4042). Circuit about 1 mile.
